## Pastoral Reflection

### **Answer the call!**

When I was an undergrad, I heard that we should read the Gospel of Matthew backwards, starting with the ending, the Great Commission. Jesus' final words to his followers—"Go and make disciples of all nations"—resound in me and find a home in my heart amidst an ordinary day in mid-summer.

Today's Gospel reading amidst occurs after Jesus calls each of his disciples by name, these very ordinary people who had commonplace lives marked by birth, growing up, marriage, children, work, and death—much like our own lives. Jesus calls these people out everyday existence to a spectacular purpose: working with him to bring about the kingdom of justice, peace, and love in this world and to prepare for the next.

In calling them, in calling us through the baptism that Paul refers to, Jesus affords each of us dignity, a purpose, and a value unique to our gifts and capacities.

For some of us, we may be called to welcome the stranger, as the Shunammite woman did, to listen with patience and openness to the prophets in our midst, no matter how unwelcome their marriage might be. Or maybe we are so=imply called to respond to someone's need for a cold cup of water to offset the heat of a blazing July sun,'
