## Pastoral Reflection

### *Love is the way*

While it may seem odd, I look forward to Lent all year because it permits me the luxury of meditating on the rich tradition of lament that is often forgotten or ignored altogether. Lament is the action of truly mourning the incompleteness of our lives, our society, and our world in the sight of God. There is a wealth of emotions bubbling in the reading from Chronicles as the destruction of Jerusalem and the temple has effectively terminated the sacred worship space of the Jewish people. Psalm 137 reiterates the destruction, and one is drawn into the devastation through the psalmist's plaintive words.

John's gospel shows a way out of the lament and devastation: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son," Love is the path out of lament and devastation. The unconditional love that God has for us is something freely given and can never be earned. Through this ultimate sacrifice on our behalf, we become people of the light, forever abandoning the darkness that threatens to overshadow hope.
